

Peg Leg of Student Cross Easter 2012

Welcome to Peg Leg 2012. Peg Leg contains all the elements of Student Cross (walking, cross carrying, liturgy, eating, drinking, music, humour, camaraderie, discussion, friendship, etc) but mixed up in different proportions to make it particularly suitable for families with young children (and hence encompassing craft, egg-rolling, children's liturgy/stations, and general mayhem...). It is probably best suited to pilgrims who have walked on Student Cross before and now want to bring their young children along but, for some people, Peg Leg has been their first experience of Student Cross, and others have come on Peg Leg without children!

This year we shall be returning to Letton Hall (<http://www.lettonhall.org/>) as our base, around which our programme of Easter activities and walks will take place. On Good Friday afternoon, we walk into Walsingham to spend the Easter weekend in Walsingham and join in the main Student Cross liturgies and activities, as well as our own Easter Vigil.

Please note that due to an unfortunate booking clash we shall this year be starting the Leg formally on Tuesday 3rd April, rather than the preceding Sunday. Our programme for the week is being finalised to account for this shorter period, but will include as much and as many of our regular activities as we can squeeze in. Costs are still to be confirmed, but are likely to be a little less than last year's rates of £200 per adult and £95 per child, because of the shorter stay.

In brief, we shall be using:

- Up to 40 beds in rooms/dormitories of between 3 and 10 people
- Fully equipped kitchen, lounge for meetings, games/craft space, dining room
- No drying room or tumble dryer, just a solar powered wind-assisted dryer (washing line!)
- Garden, woods, playground, sheep, space, more space, lots of places for children to disappear!
- A go-kart track – over 10's only (Hall rules)

NB. Letton is a ghost village – there are signs to it, but you won't find it on the map!

NNB. There is only the Hall. We shall be out in the countryside, there are no shops to 'nip out' to.

Places are usually allocated on a 'first come first served' basis. If the Leg is oversubscribed by 5th December then places will be allocated by drawing names out of a hat (we've never had to do this so far!).

We shall confirm your places early December and will ask for a deposit then. If you want to spread the cost over several payments between then and Easter or want to use an SCA bursary let the leaders know.
